**CITY TO OPEN WARMING CENTER AT THREE OAKS COMMUNITY CENTER**

The City of Vacaville will be opening a “warming center” at Three Oaks Community Center, 1100 Alamo Drive, during the current cold snap, city officials announced today.

The center will be open from 8 p.m. to 8 a.m. to accommodate those in need of warm shelter.

Both Solano County and the California Office of Emergency Services have issued press releases about the current cold wave hitting throughout the state, advising residents to the dangers of the weather and offering tips on preparing for the cold weather. “As long as the temperatures are this extreme, we plan on keeping the warming center open for those who need to come in from the cold,” City Manager David Van Kirk said. “We’ve used the other centers in the past for weather-related emergencies, and we’re prepared to do so again.”

Temperatures are expected to dip into the 20s at night during the next three or four days, and climb into the 40s during the day. The National Weather Service forecast for Monday is a low of 31 with a high of 51 degrees.

City staff and volunteers from the American Red Cross will be on hand to staff the shelter in Vacaville during the cold weather.

“We need to provide a place for those who need to come in from the cold,” Van Kirk said. “We’ll have cots, blankets and a warm place to stay.”
