### **Narrative:**

Victor Lamar Davis Jr., 24 years old arrived today at the Marin County Jail where he is awaiting his arraignment for the crimes he committed in San Rafael last month.

It is anticipated that Victor Lamar Davis Jr. will be picked up by Vacaville Police Department Detectives on Tuesday July 10 and delivered to the Solano County Jail where he will then await his arraignment in Solano County on multiple charges including: Kidnapping, Assault with Intent to Commit Rape, False Imprisonment, Assault with a Deadly Weapon, Criminal Threats, Burglary, Sodomy, Oral Copulation and Attempted Rape.

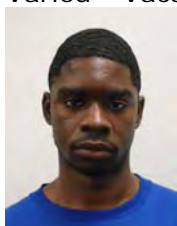

## **Narrative:**

Vacaville Police Department detectives have been investigating a series of sexual assaults dating back to June 2003, and as recent as December 2006. During the course of this investigation, members of the Vacaville Police Department have worked with allied agencies in our immediate region and in addition, the California Department of Corrections-Parole, the Solano County DAS Office, the FBI, and very closely with the California Department of Justice (DOJ) in Sacramento.

Detectives from the Family Investigative Response Services Team (FIRST) were contacted by detectives from the San Rafael Police Department on Saturday June 23, 2007. They were inquiring about a vehicle registered in our city that may have been involved in a sexual assault the previous evening. It was learned that the responsible for their assault, could very well be linked to our serial rapist based on the actions and behavior of the suspect.

Detectives from both agencies began working extremely close together once this information was shared. Additionally, these detectives have put in countless hours of time, energy and dedication in an attempt to identify and locate the responsible before he could assault another victim.

As a result of this successful joint investigation, Victor Lamar Davis Jr. 24 years old, DOB 12-28-82 of Vacaville was arrested in San Diego, Ca on Tuesday July 2, 2007 in the early evening. He was arrested by Agents from DOJ and San Diego Police Department on an arrest warrant issued out of Marin County for 261, 211, 459, 236 Penal Code. He was booked into the San Diego County Jail where he is awaiting transportation to Marin County.

We are confident and believe that Victor Lamar Davis Jr. is responsible for committing seven (7) sexual assaults in Vacaville from June 2003 through December 2006. Detectives are in the process of working with the Solano County District Attorney's Office in the filing of charges for multiple crimes on Victor Lamar Davis Jr.

Because this investigation is on-going and progressing as we speak, many of your questions regarding this investigation will not be answered based on a concern of compromising the hard work of all involved persons, and ultimately the integrity of the cases in terms of a successful prosecution and conviction.
