**Narrative:** S-Orozco has a history of domestic violence and is estranged from his girlfriend. S-Orozco was arrested Monday morning at 0100 hours, 102907 for stalking and violating a domestic violence court order while trying to enter his estranged girlfriend's residence with a butcher knife. S-Orozco made bail on 102907 and continued to stalk his estranged girlfriend. The violations were reported to the Vacaville Police Department. Officers and Detectives attempted to locate S-Orozco without success. S-Orozco was seen entering his estranged girlfriend's place of employment on three separate occasions on October 31, 2007 in violation of a valid domestic violence court order.

S-Orozco was dressed as a trick or treater when he entered the business. He was wearing a gray sweat suit and a "Scream" mask and carried a plastic trick or treat bucket. A witness recognized S-Orozco and directed police to S-Orozco. Officer Clark Bonelli attempted to contact S-Orozco, but S-Orozco fled on foot into the Safeway on Harbison Drive. Officer Bonelli gave chase through the business. S-Orozco exited the store and he was taken into custody after a struggle by Officer Clark Bonelli and FTO Joe McElligott.

Officer's determined that the trick or treat bucket had been filled with gasoline. The gasoline was tossed on the officers during the struggle. Officers also located a lighter, a BBQ lighter and some newspaper presoaked in gasoline on S-Orozco. He was arrested and booked into the Solano County Jail after being medically cleared. Detectives from the Family Investigative Response Services Team are continuing the investigation. Detectives sought and were granted an enhanced bail of \$500,000. This case is under active investigation. Anyone who believes they have information regarding this case is asked to call Detective Dave Marsh at 469-6616.
