Narrative:

During the early morning hours of February 20, 2008 an unknown responsible(s) entered new vehicles that were displayed for sale at the Vacaville Dodge Dealership. The responsible(s) removed the in-dash navigation, MP3 player, and Sirius Satellite Radio systems. The systems that were stolen are called "MYGIG" navigation and entertainment systems.

During the course of the investigation Vacaville Police Department Detectives learned that Zurab Muravyev was attempting to sell these same types of systems. A deal was made to purchase one of the systems for six hundred dollars. Zurab Muravyev was contacted in a fast food restaurant in the 5000 block of Watt Ave in Sacramento County by members of the Vacaville Police Department and the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department. He was detained and his vehicle was searched.

Inside the vehicle detectives located two "MYGIG" systems that were packaged to be mailed. Our investigation determined that one system was stolen from an auto burglary at a dealership in Elk Grove, Ca. and the second system was stolen from an auto burglary at a dealership in Bakersfield, Ca.

Zurab Muravyev was then placed under arrest for possession of stolen property and lodged in the Sacramento County Jail.
