Narrative:

On May 23 and May 24, 2009, four members of the Vacaville Police Activities League Makimoto Judo Club will compete in the California State Judo Championships in San Diego, California.

The tournament should have around 400 competitors from all over California. The format for the tournament is double elimination, meaning that if you lose two matches your are eliminated from the tournament. Competitors are grouped by age and weight with no consideration for rank.

The four members from Vacaville are Michael Fife - 14 yrs old, Cody Costello - 13 yrs old, Ronnie Wise - 12 yrs old and Hunter Costello - 9 yrs old.

Michael has been with the Vacaville PAL Judo Club for about four years and is a purple belt. He has placed in the USJF Nationals and the Junior Olympics.

Ronnie Wise has been with the Judo Club for about three years and is an orange belt. He has done well in local tournaments and placed in the State championships last year.

Cody and Hunter Costello have been with the Club for about a year and a half. They are both yellow belts and have done well in local tournaments. This is their first appearance at the State championships.
