Suspects: Suspect#1: Black male adult, 20-30 years old, medium build, 5'6"-6'0", wearing a white hooded sweatshirt with black and red camouflage, gray pants with a black stripe down the side.

Suspect# 2: Black male adult, 20-30 years old, medium build, 5'5"-5'8", wearing a black hooded zippered jacket, black t-shirt, and black pants.

Narrative:

On June 15, at about 10:42 p.m., two suspects entered the 7-Eleven convenience store at the corner of Brown Street and E. Monte Vista Avenue and acted as if they were buying beer and cigarettes. The clerk began to process the transaction when suspect #1 pointed a silver colored, short barrel revolver at the clerk and demanded money while suspect# 2 acted as a lookout. The clerk complied and emptied the cash register. The two suspects left the area on foot. At the time, there were no other patrons in the business and no vehicles were seen. Officers began checking the area and examining the crime scene when a 2nd armed robbery was reported at the Union 76 gas station on Alamo Drive near Butcher Road. At 11:11 p.m., Officers responded to this location as well and quickly learned that 2 suspects entered the convenience store/gas station, selected items and then robbed the clerk at gunpoint. The descriptions and actions of the 2 suspects in the 2nd robbery were similar to the first robbery. In both cases, there was no vehicle seen. An undetermined amount of cash and some food items were taken in both cases. Surveillance video at both locations provided insight into the actions and descriptions of the suspects and weapon used. Other agencies were notified in the event this crime spree continued elsewhere in the county. These individuals are still outstanding and considered extremely dangerous. Both robberies are still being investigated.
