Narrative:

July 19, 2009, 7:05 a.m., Vacaville Patrol Officers and Detectives from the Vacaville Police Department Family Investigative Response Services Team (F.I.R.S.T.), responded to a south Vacaville residence regarding a rape that had just occurred. Investigation revealed the victim fell asleep with the sliding patio door open. The victim awoke in the morning and found the patio sliding screen door partially ajar. The victim was subsequently confronted by the suspect in the hallway of the residence where she was sexually assaulted. After the sexual assault, the suspect told the victim he was going to the kitchen to get a knife. As the suspect entered the kitchen, the victim fled the residence through the front door. As the victim fled, the suspect fled the residence through a rear door.

Officers and Detectives learned the suspect fled the 1600 block of Alamo Drive and was last seen by a witness running through Southwood Park. This case is under active investigation. Responding Officers and Detectives conducted an extensive search of the area, but were not able to locate the suspect.

The Vacaville Police Department would like to remind the Community to take routine safety precautions. Please lock or secure all doors and windows for your safety. If you believe an unknown subject has entered your residence and is still present or if you believe a stranger has gained access to your residence, leave the residence immediately and call 911 for police assistance.
