Narrative:

On November 7, 2009 officers from Vacaville Police Youth Services Section (YSS) conducted selected enforcement in an effort to combat alcoholic beverage consumption by juveniles.

Between 8:00 p.m. and 1:00 a.m., Officers responded to reports of juvenile parties that were disturbing the peace of others and partolled City parks, schools, and other areas where juveniles might have been congregating.

One such complaint consisted of several calls of a large gathering of juveniles in the 300 block of Bowline Drive, with estimations of 25 to 100 juveniles in attendance. One of the first officers on scene estimated 60 juveniles in the area most of whom ran when they saw the arrival of police cars. Several juveniles were stopped which led to the arrest of one 14 year old female for being a minor in possession of an alcoholic beverage and minor in possession of tobacco products. The girl was issued a citation for both violations and released to an adult.

During the course of the evening, in addition to the the juvenile violations noted above, citations were issued to another female for Minor in Possession of Tobacco products, and to a male for Violation of Probation. We also contacted and identified 36 other people, the majority of them minors.

This operation was made possible by funding from a Grant that was awarded to the Vacaville Police Department by the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control. More proactive enforcement actions will be taking place in the future.
