Narrative:

The Vacaville Police Department conducted a multi-agency Sex Offender Compliance Sweep on November 12, 2009 between 2:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. The purpose of the Sex Offender Compliance Sweep was to ensure convicted sex offenders and sexually violent predators are in compliance with their registration, probation or parole conditions. This operation involved detectives from the Vacaville Police Department Family Investigative Response Services Team (F.I.R.S.T.), the Vacaville Police Department Investigative Support Section (I.S.S.), Vacaville Police Tactical Dispatchers, along with Sheriffs Deputies from the Solano County Sheriffs Office, Probation Officers from Solano County Probation, Parole Agents from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) Fairfield 2 GPS Parole Unit and Deputy U.S. Marshals from the United States Marshals Service.

The operation involved four teams that visited forty-two designated locations throughout Vacaville, Solano County and Dixon. The teams conducted thirty-six compliance checks and made four arrests. The arrested sex offenders were all placed on a CDCR parole hold based on each violating the terms of their parole. The sex offenders were booked into the Solano County Jail without incident. The Vacaville Police Department and our allied agencies from the County, State and Federal Government are committed to the safety of our community. This sex offender sweep would not have been possible without the invaluable cooperation and partnership with our allied agencies and the community.
