Narrative:

Vacaville Police and agents from the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) worked a special enforcement Friday night at the Will C. Wood High School versus Vacaville High School Black and Blue Bowl. During the course of the evening three arrests were made.

The first action involved a 17 year old male who was contacted while he was smoking on school grounds, a misdemeanor violation. He was found to also exhibit signs of having consumed an alcoholic beverage. The juvenile was issued a citation for possession of Tobacco Products and Violation of Probation and released to his guardian. This same juvenile had been drinking and was arrested for Probation Violation Saturday night, November 14, 2009, during a Party Patrol operation by Youth Services officers working under the same Grant funding.

The next incident involved contact with a 17 year old male and a 16 year old female who smelled strongly of marijuana. They were stopped at the entrance gate and a search revealed the female in possession of marijuana and rolling papers. She was issued a citation for possession of less than one ounce of marijuana. The male subject admitted to having smoked marijuana prior to their arrival. In addition to the female's arrest both students were subject to action by their respective schools for violation of Education Code policy.

The third incident resulted in a 15 year old male being booked into Juvenile Hall for Trespassing and Violation of Probation. This subject was brought to the attention of police officers by a school staff member who reported that the juvenile had been ejected twice already but was back on the premises, presumably by jumping a fence.

The juvenile was located by police, taken into custody, and removed from the premises.

Sporting events, dances, or other functions which are organized and sanctioned by schools are subject to the same school rules and Education Code guidelines that apply on or around school campuses during regular school hours. This is often not realized by students who misbehave at these types of functions. In addition to any legal action that may generate from illegal activity, the students will also be held accountable through the school discipline policies. School administrators work closely with Vacaville Police Youth Services Officers to insure a safe environment for all who attend these events.
