Narrative:

On the above date and time, detectives from the Narcotics Enforcement (NET) and Crime Suppression Teams (CST) conducted a traffic stop on (S)Wise on I-680 in Martinez. NET detectives had been investigating Wise and his girlfriends (S)House for marijuana sales. Detectives then served a narcotics search warrant on Marigold Drive in Fairfield where the couple lives with (S)McNary. A search of Wise's vehicle and the residence located several firearms, an indoor marijuana grow, concentrated cannabis, processed marijuana and evidence of marijuana sales. Both Wise and McNary were in possession of firearms when they were contacted by police. Detectives then drove to Suisun where they contacted (S)House at her place of employment and searched her incident to the warrant. She was found to be in possession of marijuana packaged for sale.

The home owner, Joshua McNary was arrested for cultivation of marijuana and being armed during the commission of a felony. Andrew Wise was arrested for cultivation and possession for sale of marijuana, possession of concentrated cannabis and being armed during the commission of a felony. Tiffany House was arrested for possession of concentrated cannabis and possession of marijuana for sale. All three suspects were subsequently transported to the county jail in Fairfield for booking.

Narcotics Enforcement detectives are frequently contacting citizens who are unfamiliar with the current state of the law in California with regards to medical marijuana. Proposition 215, the Compassionate Use Act, does not authorize the sale of marijuana to anyone. The Vacaville Police Department has a zero tolerance policy towards illegal drug sales and use in our community. While California State Law authorizes some individuals to possess small amounts of marijuana for medical purposes, the cultivation or possession of marijuana for sale is illegal and not sanctioned or allowed by the Police Department.
