### **THREE NAPA COUNTY RESIDENTS ARRESTED IN BURGLARIES AT GUCCI STORE**

Vacaville Police, with the assistance of the Napa Police Department, have arrested three individuals in connection with two burglaries of over \$110,000 worth of merchandise at the Gucci Factory Store located at the Vacaville Premium Outlets.

S-Richard Allen Gramlich and S-Javier Orozco, both of Napa, and S-Jose DeHaro of American Canyon were arrested and charged in both burglaries. S-DeHaro was already in custody at Solano County Jail on an unrelated charge, while S-Gramlich and S-Orozco were arrested in Napa.

On October 13, 2009, the Gucci Factory Store, located at 284 Nut Tree Road, was burglarized. Three suspects entered the business by smashing out the glass front door, where they took several items. The total loss to the business was approximately \$30,000 worth of Gucci-brand products. A very similar burglary occurred on November 6, 2009 at the same location, with three suspects taking approximately \$80,000 worth of Gucci-brand products. During the second burglary, a security guard working at the outlets spotted the suspects fleeing the area in a dark-colored Volkswagon four-door vehicle and contacted police.

During the course of its investigation, the Vacaville Police Department obtained several search warrants related to the burglaries. On January 27, 2010, with the assistance of the Napa Police Department SWAT Team, a search warrant was served at the residence of S-Javier Orozco in Napa.

The SWAT team was utilized as a safety measure because of intelligence that had been gathered and the criminal history of the occupants of the target residence. S-Orozco, living in an apartment on Marina Drive in Napa, was taken into custody without incident.

Shortly thereafter, detectives from the Vacaville Investigative Services Section and the Napa Police Department arrested S-Gramlich without incident at his home on Golden Gate Circle in Napa. Detectives then contacted S-DeHaro at the Solano County Jail, where he was already in custody on unrelated charges.

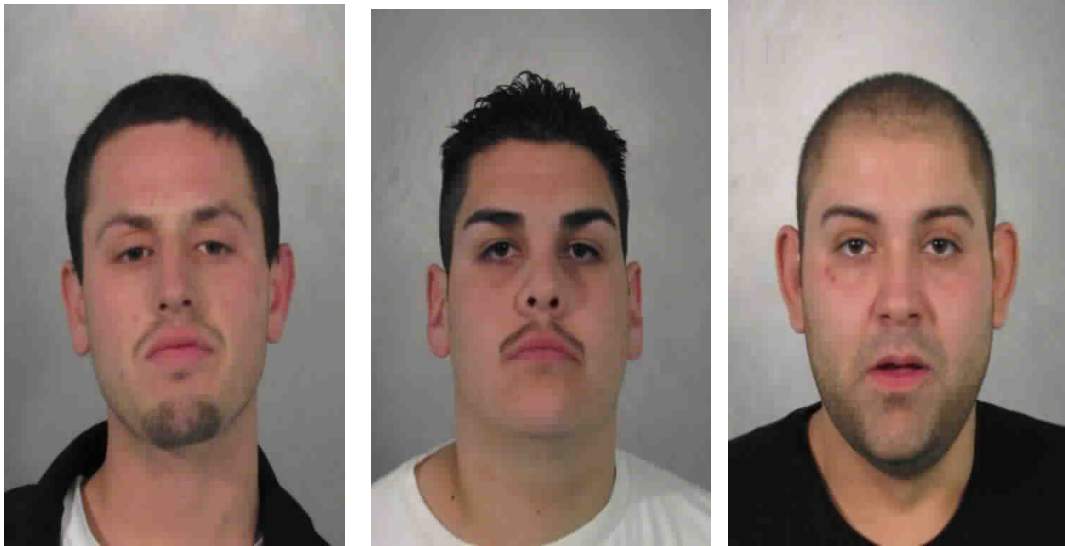

Numerous items of evidence and stolen property have been recovered from the searches that have been conducted.

Gucci has made several changes to the store since these burglaries occurred that have increased the security of the business. These changes will make a similar crime unlikely to succeed and make the apprehension of any future suspects more likely for police.

This investigation is still underway, and attempts are being made to locate more of the stolen property.
