FOUR ARRESTED FOR VARIETY OF DRUG AND DRUG-RELATED CHARGES

Vacaville police on Thursday arrested four people on a variety of drug and drug-related charges, including operating an illegal medical marijuana dispensary.

Detectives from the Investigative Services Division served a search warrant at North Bay Alternative Healing, located at 537 Merchant Street. Vacaville narcotics detectives had identified the business as a marijuana dispensary that was operating without a business license for this purpose. A search of the business revealed extensive evidence of marijuana sales, a violation of current California State law.

Flash Gordon, 31, was identified as the proprietor of the business and William Treat, 30, Dustin Hansen, 29, and Elaine Harris, 25, were identified as employees. Following a search of the business and the personal residences of Gordon, Treat and Hansen, police arrested all four for possession of marijuana for sale.

Treat was also arrested for possession of Vicodin and a dangerous weapon after detectives discovered a set of brass knuckles and approximately 100 Vicodin tablets hidden in his garage in the 2000 block of Day Break Court in Fairfield. All four suspects were subsequently transported to the county jail in Fairfield for booking.

Narcotics Enforcement detectives are frequently contacting citizens who are unfamiliar with the current law in California regarding medical marijuana. Proposition 215, the Compassionate Use Act, does not authorize the sale of marijuana for profit to anyone.

The City of Vacaville also has a moratorium on medical marijuana dispensaries in effect, which prohibits the operation of a marijuana dispensary within the city limits.

While California State Law authorizes some individuals to possess marijuana for medical purposes, the cultivation or possession of marijuana for sale is illegal.

The Vacaville Police Department has a zero tolerance policy towards illegal drug sales and use in our community. The public is encouraged to report all suspected drug activity to our DRUG TIP LINE at 449-5243. Callers can remain anonymous and all information is welcome.
