### **COOPERATION LEADS TO ARREST OF SUSPECT IN PAIR OF BURGLARIES**

Vacaville police on Thursday evening arrested a Fairfield man suspected in two attempted residential burglaries in the last week.

S-Kurt Alan Dasilva, 32, of Fairfield was arrested after he was identified on a video surveillance system installed at one of the burglary locations.

On Tuesday, May 25, 2010, an attempted residential burglary took place on Linwood Street. During the crime, a video surveillance system captured images of the suspect and his vehicle. Approximately two hours later, a resident on Arcadia Drive, upon returning home, interrupted a residential burglary. When the resident arrived home, the burglar got into the passenger seat of a car being driven by a female and fled the area. The burglar entered the home through an unlocked door.

Officers and detectives were able to link these two burglaries, and detectives from the Investigative Services Section (ISS) distributed photographs of the burglar and his car to other officers. An alert patrol officer shared these photographs with local parole agents, who then identified S-Dasilva, currently on parole, as the suspect.

Detectives and patrol officers worked with the Fairfield Police Department and were able to locate and apprehend Dasilva. A parole search was conducted at S-Dasilva's residence and evidence of the crimes was located.

S-Dasilva was booked into Solano County Jail for the attempted burglary on Linwood Street, the burglary on Arcadia Drive, and for violating the terms of his parole.

The Vacaville Police Department appreciates the good working relationship we enjoy with the community and the alert citizens who are willing to be good witnesses. We would also like to remind citizens that some crimes are crimes of opportunity and securing your residence and vehicles can deter crime and prevent you from becoming a victim.
