FOUR ARRESTED FOR SERIES OF THEFTS FROM VEHICLES IN VACAVILLE

Vacaville police arrested four individuals early Thursday morning following a series of thefts from unlocked vehicles.

At approximately 12:30 a.m. Thursday, police responded to the 100 block of Stanton Avenue regarding two people looking into vehicles. Officers arrived and detained two people hiding in the bushes on Burlington Drive. They were identified as S-Phillip Liberto, 18, and S-Joshua Carrillo, 18, both of Fairfield. The suspects were in possession of property later identified as recently stolen from unlocked vehicles in the neighborhood.

Further investigative efforts led to two additional arrests of S-Anthony Deshazo, 18, and a 16-year-old juvenile. Both were discovered on Hartford Avenue and were in possession of stolen property. All suspects were booked into the Solano County Jail and Juvenile Hall, respectively on charges of possession of stolen property, conspiracy, and prowling. S-Deshazo was also arrested for being in violation of his parole.

Vacaville residents are urged to lock and remove valuables from all parked vehicles. Remember "TLC" – **T**ake your valuables out of your car, **L**ock your car doors, and **C**lose all windows and doors. Following these three easy steps will help prevent auto crimes and protect vehicles from being a victim of a theft or burglary.
