POLICE ARREST VACAVILLE MAN FOR ALLEGED HOMICIDE

NARRATIVE:

Vacaville police arrested a Vacaville resident late Thursday evening on charges of homicide.

At approximately 10:39 p.m. on September 8, 2011 on Thursday evening, the Vacaville Communication Center received a call of shots fired in the 200 block of Cambridge Drive. Patrol units responded to the area and took up a perimeter around the home. Officers attempted to contact a male subject inside the home, but were unsuccessful. Initial reports indicated that a domestic violence incident had occurred and a female had been shot.

A 911 dispatcher was able to communicate with a 17-year-old female juvenile in the home. The dispatcher was able to direct her and three (3) other children to the rear of the residence, where a patrol officer was able to evacuate them to a safe location.

Officers on the perimeter were finally successful in communicating with the male subject and he was taken into custody. A female was found in the attached garage on the floor, where she was pronounced dead by paramedics on scene.

The male suspect has been identified as S-Sidney Wilson, 33, of Vacaville. He was booked into the Solano County Jail in Fairfield for homicide. The female victim's identification is being withheld at this time until proper family notification can be completed. Detectives from the Investigative Services Section (ISS) and the Family Investigative Response and Services Team (FIRST) responded to the scene and took over the investigation. The children in the home were taken into protective custody at the scene and later released to family members.

The investigation is ongoing at this time and updates may be forthcoming in the near future.
