Narrative:

On Thursday, January 26, 2012, officers attempted to stop a green, 1994 Acura which appeared to have a reported stolen license plate attached to it. The vehicle failed to yield to police officers near the area of Eastbound I-80 at Allison Drive. The vehicle fled the area at a high rate of speed with Vacaville PD units in pursuit.

The pursuit continued onto Weber Road with the vehicle occasionally reaching speeds in excess of 90 miles per hour. The pursuit continued onto Highway 113, heading northbound towards the city of Dixon.

Near the outskirts of Dixon, the vehicle was disabled utilizing a tire deflating device. The pursuit terminated near the intersection of West A Street and Interstate 80 in the city of Dixon, when the driver lost control of the vehicle near the freeway onramp.

At the time that the vehicle pursuit ended, a short foot pursuit ensued and (S) Ayson and (S) Mares were arrested. The entire pursuit was approximately 23.1 miles.

(S) Mares was arrested for two (2) warrants (3056 PC – Parole Violation & 10851 CVC – Vehicle theft), 148 PC – Obstructing a police officer, and 10851 CVC – Vehicle theft.

(S) Ayson was arrested for 10851 CVC – Vehicle theft & 475(b) PC – Possessing forged checks.
